PRH MATERNITY SAVED

Mid Sussex MP, Nicholas Soames, and local Conservative Councillors have warmly welcomed the decision by NHS West Sussex to retain the Consultant-led maternity services at the Princess Royal Hospital.

"After a tremendous fight and with terrific support from all parts of the Mid Sussex Community we are delighted that the proposals put forward by the Brighton and Sussex University Hospitals NHS Trust earlier this year have been accepted"; says Nicholas Soames. "The whole community deserves great credit for rallying around the PRH and at last local people can have confidence about the future of our vital and much loved local hospital services."

Margaret Baker, adds: "It's been a long hard battle but it was well worth the fight as the threat to these services had caused deep concern in the Community."



SOAMES SAYS

I' before 'E' - Infrastructure before Expansion

Nicholas Soames has continued to make the case in the House of Commons for increased spending on Mid Sussex's already over-stretched infrastructure.

In his role as Co-Chair of the Cross Party Group on Balanced Migration Nicholas has been putting forward the case for a system of 'balanced migration'. Nicholas says; "The population is projected to reach 70m by 2028; a significant cause of this growth is as a result of the Government's immigration policy. The Government has bowed to pressure from the Group on key strands of its policy but there remains a lot of work to be done."



ONLINE CHECK ON COUNCIL SPENDING

To back their management watch on the District Council's expenditure, Conservative Councillors have implemented the online publication of information on any spending over £500, one of the first councils to do so.

Councillor Jonathan Ash-Edwards says: "We want residents to be able to see exactly how their money is being spent - important locally but it's also Conservative national policy that all Government expenditure over £25,000 will be available online to taxpayers."

CHIEF EXEC'S PAY CUT

The Conservative led District Council has cut the Chief Executive's pay. From 2010, the cost of his total remuneration package will be permanently reduced by £14,000 a year. He will get no bonuses in future and only cost of living increases fixed nationally.

Jonathan Ash-Edwards says: "We are working hard to control costs and have acted firmly to renegotiate terms set in a very different climate. That said, the Chief Executive has met the targets set in his original contract."

A Liberal Democrat motion against the new proposals flopped as many of their councillors abstained or missed the vote.

SHOP LOCALLY

Conservative Councillors are supporting the Right Up Your Street Plans to encourage the community to shop locally.

“The present economic situation is difficult for us all,” says Councillor Simon Bedding. “But it is vital to support local traders as much as we can.” The Council is placing strong emphasis on economic development and is working closely with business organisations to achieve this.

PARKING PROGRESS

Conservative Councillors are leading an MSDC review of parking strategy. An advisory panel is reviewing all the options for future provision and pricing – as part of this process, they will be consulting with the community including local businesses.

“Parking matters to people,” says Councillor Margaret Baker “That’s why we honoured our manifesto pledge not to raise prices for first two years of this council. Even when we did, we kept the short term charges as they were! There has been some change in usage of the long term parking while short term parking numbers

have increased. The additional income for the year will continue to help us keep Council Tax down.”

She added that the Council’s car parks had benefitted from investment in improvements and had won plaudits from independent assessors for the quality of their management. “Liberal Democrats, as ever, misled. They want increases every year and, of course, were keen to rob the Council’s reserves rather than implement modest changes which still leave Mid Sussex charges very competitive,” she said.
