

RELIEF ROAD OPENS EARLY

The long awaited Haywards Heath relief road has opened over a year ahead of schedule. The road will reduce congestion in the town centre and provide another east-west route for motorists.

After years of delays by developers, Conservative Councillors used planning conditions to prevent developers from building more houses in the south of town until the road was finished.

County Councillor Pete Bradbury said: "After years of waiting, it's fantastic to see the relief road now being used by motorists. Reduced congestion in the town centre will give us opportunities to improve accessibility and the environment".

Mid Sussex MP Sir Nicholas Soames said: "The death of Tim Farmer robs our community of a wise, energetic, effective leader. He was a real contributor to the battle of life. RIP".

KNOW WHEN THE NEXT BUS ARRIVES!

Real time bus information is now available in Haywards Heath thanks to the town's transport partnership. Working with bus companies, Councils have installed electronic displays in South Road and the Princess Royal Hospital so passengers know when the next bus will arrive.

County Councillor Pete Bradbury says: "Tim Farmer and I started the transport partnership in 2011 and since then it has made real progress in improving public transport in Haywards Heath. We believe that real time bus information is the single thing most likely to increase bus usage in the town. South Road and the Princess Royal Hospital is just phase one".

Conservative campaigner Geoff Rawlinson, pictured, adds: "Our vision is to roll this out right across Haywards Heath and Bolnore Village and we know that many residents are keen to see this happen as well".
